The three airports that are open and operational for international air travel are OR Tambo International (in Johannesburg, Gauteng), Cape Town International (in Cape Town, Western Cape), King Shaka International in (Durban, KwaZulu-Natal), Kruger Mpumalanga and Lanseria Airports.

Through South African Official Gazette signed on June 22, 2022, the requirements for vaccinations against COVID and negative PCR tests to enter the Republic, as well as border controls for the disease have been eliminated. The mandatory wearing of masks indoors and limitations on gatherings have also been lifted.

However, the obligation to submit the traveler's health questionnaire prior to entry or on arrival at the port of entry remains mandatory.

In addition, all international travelers must have travel insurance that must cover expenses related to COVID-19 test and quarantine costs, if necessary.

**In the interest of all citizens, and the continuing public health efforts, South Africa reserves the right to deny entry of any traveller who is travelling from a high-risk country for tourism purposes.**
